Important Information

- Applications are invited from the candidates for **online admission** to Semester I in B.A. and B. Sc. (Under CCF, 2022) courses for the Academic Session 2025-26. Please visit the website www.loretocollege.edu.in and view **ADMISSIONS**.
- The process of admission for the academic session 2025-26 of Loreto College will be entirely online and is handled by Loreto College, a religious minority institution and is not under the purview of the centralized admission process, Department of Higher Education, WB Government (Ref: G.O. No. 265-Edn (CS)/ OM102L/2022 dated 24/04/23).
- It is to be noted that the applicants seeking admission to this college are strongly discouraged to come to the college physically for any enquiry or for any other purpose from the beginning to the end of the admission process. They will not be allowed to enter the college premises under any circumstances.
- The entire process will take place online and the only source for information and assistance regarding application forms and admission would be through the official college website.
- The College will not be responsible for any other sources of information.
- No application will be received after the last date of application as announced on the college website.

Admission related Information

- Loreto College offers Four- Year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours with or without Research) Course and Three-Year B.A. / B.Sc. Multidisciplinary Course at the UG level
- Admission to Semester-wise Four-Year B.A./B.Sc. (Honours with or without Research) Degree Courses under Curriculum and Credit Framework, 2022 (CCF, 2022) under the University of Calcutta will be guided by Admission Regulations (Notification No. CSR/05/2023 dated 23/06/2023) of the University of Calcutta.
- Aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks of the BEST FOUR subjects (at least 100 marks paper). Marks in compulsory Environmental Education / Studies will not be taken into consideration for calculation of aggregate marks.
- Applicants are required to fill up every field of the online application form carefully. No change will be permitted after final submission of the online application.
- Admission is liable to be cancelled at the time of verification of documents or at any later stage if the documents are not in conformity with the information provided on the online form.
- Applicants must take a **PRINTOUT** of the **APPLICATION FORM** after successful submission on the college website.
- Admission will be conducted strictly on the basis of merit. The subject wise merit lists will be prepared based on INDEX FACTOR (refer to Eligibility Criteria) for all categories of students across all disciplines.
- Admission to any course of the college is provisional and is subject to verification of original documents and final approval of the University of Calcutta.
- Candidates are required to furnish an active MOBILE NUMBER and EMAIL ID preferably their own, on the application form. All subsequent communications will be conducted via these channels. The college bears no responsibility for any communication failures due to mobile phone settings or technical issues with the operator.

COURSES OF STUDIES UNDER CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK
(CCF, 2022)**

These Regulations shall be called **THE REGULATIONS FOR SEMESTER WISE FOUR YEAR B.A./B.Sc. DEGREE PROGRAMME** under CCF, 2022 (CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK), UNIVERSITY OF CALCUTTA.

- **Duration of the Programme:**

The B.A./ B.Sc. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of **Eight (08)** (with an exit option after completion of 2nd/4th/6th Semesters) **consecutive semesters of six months each**, i.e. the odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year.

- **Eligibility for Admission:**

A student who has passed the Class XII Examination from the All India Boards/Councils in four recognized subjects including English is eligible to seek admission to the 1st Year of the B.A./B.Sc (Single-Major) Course of Studies. Three years Major candidates must obtain a minimum of 60% in the subject/related subject.

- A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the B.A./B.Sc. (Single-Major) Course of Studies provided the candidate has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100. However, no student shall be allowed to take admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.
- Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) are not required to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
- For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc./ (Single-Major) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in

order of marks secured by a student. **Marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject “Environmental Science” is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.**

- A student taking up a **Major Course** in a subject must have obtained:
 - A minimum of 50% marks in the aggregate and 45% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
OR
 - 55% marks in the subject or related subject at the previous qualifying examination.
OR
 - 50% marks in the aggregate when the student has not studied the subject in his/her previous qualifying examination provided all other clauses are satisfied.

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A candidate wishing to apply for a **B. A. degree** must choose her **Major** subject from **any ONE** of the following:

A Student shall be allowed to take up Major in Economics if the candidate has passed in Mathematics at the H.S. Examination (10+2) conducted by the West Bengal Council of H.S. Education or its equivalent examination in Mathematics/ Business Mathematics/ Applied Mathematics. Students who have passed Business Economics including Business Mathematics in H.S.(10+2) level from West Bengal Council of H.S. Education are also eligible for admission with Economics as the Major subject. Students of Economics Major have to take up Mathematics as one of the Minor subjects.

If the student has not studied Education as a subject in the previous qualifying examination then Psychology/ Philosophy/ Mathematics/Sociology/ Economics/ Political Science/ History /Statistics /Physics /Chemistry /Biology be treated as related subjects.

B.Sc. (Honours with/without Research)

A candidate wishing to apply for **B. Sc. degree** must choose her **Major** subject from **any ONE** of the following:

A Student shall be allowed to take up Major in Economics if the candidate has passed in Mathematics at the H.S. Examination (10+2) conducted by the West Bengal Council of H.S. Education or its equivalent examination in Mathematics/ Business Mathematics/ Applied Mathematics. Students who have passed Business Economics including Business Mathematics in H.S.(10+2) level from West Bengal Council of H.S. Education are also eligible for admission with Economics as the Major subject. Students of Economics Major have to take up Mathematics as one of the Minor subjects.

A student will have to study Discipline Specific Core Courses (**DSCC**), **Minor Courses**, Ability Enhancement Courses (**AEC**), Skill Enhancement Courses (**SEC**), Common Value Added Courses (**CVAC**) and Interdisciplinary Courses (**IDC**). All courses other than AEC and CVAC will have one **Practical/Tutorial**. There will be a **Summer Internship** in the 2nd or 4th or 6th semesters.

**AEC (MIL) subjects offered are: Alternative English, Bengali and Hindi. The college does not have a Department of Urdu.*

Research/Dissertation

Students obtaining **CGPA equivalent to 75% marks** after successful completion of all the first 6 semesters may opt for **Honours with Research Degree Course** in the 7th and 8th Semesters.

- Students choosing a **4-year Bachelor's degree (Single major with Research course)** are required to take up research projects under the guidance of a faculty member in the 7th and 8th semesters.
- Students pursuing a **4-year Major Degree without Research** will have to study an additional 1 DSC/Core paper of 4 credits in the 7th Semester & 2 DSC/ Core Papers of 4 Credits each in the 8th Semester.

- **Duration of the Programme** The B.A./ B.Sc. Programme shall be for a minimum duration of six (06) consecutive semesters (with an exit option after 2nd and 4th) of six months each, i.e. The odd semester will start ordinarily in the month of July and the even semester in the month of January of every year. **A student prosecuting a regular course of study for semester wise degree course shall have to clear all semesters in all respect within a span of seven years from the year of admission to the particular course and combination, failing which enrolment of the student shall stand cancelled.**

Explanation: A student already admitted in this course may seek fresh admission with different course/ subject combination (with respect to Core/ Minor subjects) subject to clause no 4 in the CSR (Please use the link provided above)

- Students who have already successfully completed any U.G. degree earlier are not eligible to take admission into above course.
- A student who has passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) or its equivalent Examination is eligible to seek admission to the 1st year of the B.A./B.Sc. (Multidisciplinary) Course of Studies provided the candidate has also passed in English having full marks not being less than 100 and fulfills the conditions as laid down in clauses 5,10,11 and 12 (Refer to CSR-link provided).
- Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Vocational examination conducted by the West Bengal State Council of Vocational Education and Training shall be eligible to seek admission to the B.A. (Multidisciplinary) 1st year Course of Studies taking the subjects under **Humanities Discipline** only.

However, no student shall be allowed admission after a lapse of more than 3 years from the year of passing the previous qualifying examination.

(Explanation: The year of admission shall not be taken into account while calculating three years from the year of passing the previous qualifying Examination).

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- Students who have passed the Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination or its equivalent from the All India Boards/Councils (i.e. CBSE, ISC and National Institute of Open Schooling) need not require to submit the Migration Certificate for getting Registration under this University.
- For the purpose of determining eligibility for admission to the B.A./B.Sc. (Multidisciplinary) Courses, aggregate marks shall be calculated by adding the marks in top-four subjects in order of marks secured by a student. However, marks in compulsory Environmental Education/Studies shall not be taken into account for calculation of aggregate marks. However, if the subject "Environmental Science" is studied as an elective subject of 100 marks, it may be taken into account for the purpose of determining the aggregate marks.

Disciplines of Multidisciplinary Courses for B.A. /B.Sc

- (i) Humanities Discipline: History, English, Bengali, Hindi, Political Science, Sociology, Education, Journalism & Mass Communication, Human Rights
- (ii) Science Discipline: Geography, Economics, Statistics, Mathematics, Film Studies.

Outline of CURRICULUM AND CREDIT FRAMEWORK (CCF):

Category of subjects:

- A) Core Course (CC):** Courses, to be compulsorily studied by a student as the requirement of Core subjects.
- B) Minor:** A subject to be studied by the student with lesser number of courses than the two core subjects.
- C) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** AEC courses are the course based on the knowledge of languages. There shall be two AEC Courses:
 - a) Compulsory English**
 - b) MIL/Alternative English**
 - MIL includes: Bengali and Hindi. The college does not have a Department of Urdu.
- D) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):** These courses are designed to provide skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing competencies, skills etc.
- E) Practical/ Tutorial:** All courses other than AEC & CVAC will have one Practical/ Tutorial. Wherever there is a practical, there will be no Tutorial and vice-versa.
- F) Common Value Added Course (CVAC):** These are based on Knowledge of Human & Social Values. Semester 1: ENVs and Constitutional Values & Semester 2: ENVs, Lifestyle Diseases and their Prevention, Hands-On Machine Learning, Indian Knowledge System and its Applications & Value Oriented Life Skill Education.
- G) Summer Internship:** All students are required to do one 3 credits Summer Internship at the end of the 2nd or 4th or 6th semester.
- H) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC):** There shall be 3 IDCs of 3 credits each, to be studied in the first 3 semesters.

Seats in all subjects are limited. Candidates will be accommodated in the courses of their choice if seats are available. In case of unavailability they would have to opt for another course
