15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Delineate the vision/plan of institution to transform itself into a holistic multidisciplinary institution. Keeping in mind the Vision of the institution and believing that our institution must be a dynamic entity, interdisciplinary programmes were organized. An International Conference titled Reflections on the Impact of Pandemics on People, Places and Communities: A Social Science International Interdisciplinary Conference was organized by Social Science Research Council (SSRC), U.S.A in collaboration with the Department of Geography, Loreto College, Kolkata, India on July 26, 2023. A Five-Day Workshop on Research Methodology and sessions on Research Methodologywere organized by Internal Quality Assurance Cellcutting across all departments thereby enhancing understanding of diverse research methods and integrating and provide critical skills to equip students for cross disciplinary challenges. An International Seminar on Mapping Memory: History , Texts and Culture was organised by the departments of English and History. The conference featured multidisciplinary presentations on the concept of "memory" and its dynamic interrelationships with history, literature, art, politics, and society. Staff Development Seminar on NEP was conducted to help the faculty navigate the changes brought by the new policy and to gain insights on effective strategies for establishing partnerships with industry and other stakeholders to facilitate meaningful internship opportunities for students. A Workshop on Life Skills Empowerment for Aspiring Educators was organised to equip the students with essential life skills through a series of interactive sessions and activities. Workshops on AI Tools for students and teachers were organised to enhance creativity, innovation, productivity and efficiency. Faculty development Programme by Wadhwani Foundation to equip the faculty members of Loreto College with advanced e-content and tools that would enable them to train students for the evolving job market. The Library Society organized an inter-disciplinary book club on May 14, 2024 on the theme Witching Hour. It helped in fostering a sense of community, bringing together individuals with a shared passion

for reading and love for learning. Another session was organised on April 16, 2024 on the theme Dynamic Duos in Literature and Pop Culture. The session allowed the students to gain new perspectives on the chosen topic and sharpened their critical thinking skills. Career Counselling Sessions were organised for all students across disciplines to help them understand how their diverse skills and knowledge can be integrated into viable career options. As Loreto College offers only subjects related to Humanities ans Social Science, It enables students to progress at their own pace through adaptive learning platforms integrating their knowledge with the scientific and technological concepts . On May 14, 2024, a Blood Donation Camp was organised by the Social Service Society (SSS) and the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit of Loreto College, Kolkata, in collaboration with the Association of Voluntary Blood Donors, West Bengal. The National Service Scheme (NSS) Society of Loreto College, Kolkata organised a talk on September 27, 2023 to spread awareness of dengue and malaria and to encourage students to adopt suitable precautionary measures. On September 24, 2023, a group of 10 volunteers visited St. Joseph's Old Age Home located at AJC Bose Road, Kolkata to offer their services to the elderly in observance of NSS Day. The National Service Scheme (NSS) Society of Loreto College, Kolkata organized a series of clean-up drives in collaboration with Bhoomi Foundation in the month of September, 2023 to celebrate World Cleanup Day on September 16, 2023. The National Service Scheme (NSS) Society in collaboration with the Social Service Society of Loreto College, Kolkata organized "Joy of Giving Week" from October 2 to 13, 2023. All students of Loreto College generously donated items such as clothes, shoes, utensils, and toys, which were then handed over to Goonj Foundation. On October 16, 2023, three volunteers from the National Service Scheme (NSS) Society of Loreto College, Kolkata

participated in the Khadi Mahotsav Rally tp promote start-up initiatives involving Khadi and Gram Udyog Bhavan. Kalakriti, the annual event by the Department of Psychology and the Psychology Society of Loreto College was organised on November 28, 2023 to foster inclusivity and talent of differently abled children. On December 1, 2023, the National Service Scheme (NSS) Society of Loreto College, Kolkata observed World AIDS Day by organizing a talk to spread awareness about HIV/AIDS and dispel common myths associated with the disease. The Mahatma Gandhi National Council of Rural Education (MGNCRE) Cell organised a visit to Ramkrishna Old Age Home Trust located on Hari Ghosh Street, Shyambazar on January 13, 2024. The Leadership Training Service (LTS) Society of Loreto College, Kolkata celebrated Communal Harmony Week by conducting three events between January 11 and February 15, 2024. The institution is committed to contributing to the upliftment of society for which the college has organised a number of events. The National Service Scheme (NSS) Society of Loreto College, Kolkata took the initiative of spreading awareness and joy during the festive season. On October 13, 2023, a group of 11 NSS volunteers visited Bal Shiksha Sadan, a Government Primary School to spread awareness regarding the significance of Yoga in our daily lives. The activity ended with the distribution of stationery items. The activity also fostered their sense of social responsibility. The Annual Special Camp organised by the NSS unit of Loreto College, Kolkata was held between January 8 and 15, 2024. Basic lessons on Mathematics, English Grammar, Spoken English, and Social Etiquette were imparted to the children. The NSS volunteers also organised awareness camps focusing on Dengue-Malaria, Human Trafficking, Hygiene, and Menstrual Hygiene. Inspiring people to increase greenery on Earth, the Greenovation Club of Loreto College, Kolkata conducted a plant distribution event on January 9 and 10, 2024. A Session on Energy Conservation and Energy Efficiency was organised by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Loreto College on February 8, 2024. The W.E. Nature Society of Loreto College, Kolkata, in collaboration with the National Service Scheme (NSS) Unit, organised a two-day workshop on April 18 and 19, 2024 to commemorate Earth Day 2024. On April 22, 2024, the W.E. Nature Society of Loreto College, Kolkata invited the undergraduate students of Semester IV and Semester VI to take a green pledge in order to foster a sense of commitment to environmental sustainability within the student community. Staff Development Seminar on Life Skills Capacity Building on May 17, 2024 to reinforce the institution's commitment to imparting an educational experience that equips students with the skills necessary to thrive in a rapidly changing world in alignment with NEP requirements. On June 6 and 7, 2024, Loreto College, Kolkata, hosted a Faculty Development Programme organised by Wadhwani Foundation. The programme aimed to equip the faculty members of Loreto College with advanced e-content and tools that would enable them to train students for the evolving job market which is a basic requirement as per NEP guidelines. A Session in alignment with NEP was organised by the Department of Education on November 29, 2023 to observe National Education Day.

On May 15, 2024, IDP IELTS India conducted an informative session for students pursuing History Honours and Major in Loreto College, Kolkata. During the session, IDP representatives highlighted their team of expert and certified

counsellors who provide essential support to students. On March 28, 2024, the Career Counselling Cell, Loreto College, organised an interactive session on Interview Skills and C.V. Writing. International Human Rights Day was celebrated on December 11, 2023 where applications of International Humanitarian Law was discussed. On November 29, 2023, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Loreto College organised a compelling lecture on Professional Ethics - Inspiring Trust and Fostering Integrity tailored for 3rd-year students. On November 29, 2023, the Department of Political Science at Loreto College, Kolkata organized a programme to observe Constitution Day to provide a a holistic understanding of both radical and moderate nationalism, offering insights into the complexities of the nation's ideological journey.. During May 13 --16, 2024, the Department of B.Ed. at Loreto College, Kolkata organised an enriching Life Skills Certificate Course for the teacher-trainees of Semester II and IV. On June 25, 2024, Workshop on Life Skills was organised for the Student Council. Describe any good practice/s of the institution pertaining to the Skill development in view of NEP 2020. In order to hone the skills of the students, a number of add-on courses are conducted by the institution. Calligraphy and Cursive writing are important skills which help the students to stimulate creativity, develop fine motor skills and improve concentration. A 30-hour course on Human Rights and Empowerment was organised by the department of Human Rights. A 30-hour course on Python was organised by the department of Computer Science to help students in web development, Data Science and Machine Learning. It develops problem-solving skills and makes them market ready. A Workshop on Pandemics and Methods of Data Collection: Challenges, Innovation and Lessons Learned was organized by Social Science Research Council (SSRC), U.S.A in collaboration with the Department of Geography, Loreto College, Kolkata, India on July 27, 2023. A talk on 'Artificial Intelligence and the Future Ahead' was organized in Loreto College, Kolkata on September 14, 2023 for the undergraduate students of the third year. On October 6, 2023, Loreto College, Kolkata hosted the Eastern Regional Finals of ConQuest, India's premier national quiz on the Indian Constitution, History, and Politics organized by the Centre for Law and Policy Research, Bangalore. The process of organizing the event also gave them the opportunity to develop valuable skills such as team management and communication. On November 29, 2023, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Loreto College organised a compelling lecture on "Professional Ethics - Inspiring Trust and Fostering Integrity" tailored for 3rd-year students. The session centered on the core

values of integrity, honesty, and responsibility. The Department of Geography, Loreto College, Kolkata organised an Interactive Career Counselling Session on "Navigating Futures: Success in Entrance Examinations and Careers in Disaster Management" in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on January 4, 2024 to inculcate the skills of cracking entrance examniations . The Debating Society of Loreto College, Kolkata organised Diaphonia, an intra-college inter-departmental debate competition, on May 28, 2024 to help the students nurture their debating skills. On March 21, 2024, the Semester VI students of Loreto College, Kolkata participated in a Webinar on Digital Marketing organised by YoursthatSenior to enable the students understand the ways of imbibing the skills of digital marketing. The Career Counselling Cell, Loreto College, organised an interactive session on Interview Skills and C.V. Writing on March 28, 2024. On April 15, 2024, an International Workshop on MOJO (Mobile Journalism) was organized by the Department of Journalism & Mass Communication in collaboration with Indo Bangla Media Educators Network. The workshop aimed to explain to the students the nuances and practicality of mobile journalism. On April 3, 2024, the Semester II students of the Department of B.Ed., Loreto College, Kolkata attended a workshop on 'First Aid and Basic Life Support' organised by the Institute of Preventive Awareness, Kolkata and the Department of B.Ed. in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell. The Computer Department of Loreto College, Kolkata organised a highly engaging and informative workshop on Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools for its students on April 15, April 17, and April 29, 2024 to upgrade them onAI tools an its applications On April 30, 2024, the Psychology Society in collaboration with the Department of Psychology, Loreto College, Kolkata, organised an Expressive Arts Therapy session. It was aimed to be a transformative experience, fostering deep emotional exploration and self-expression among the attendees. On May 11, 2024, a research methodology workshop for the post-graduate students of English was organised by the Department of English in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell to impart basic and advanced insights into the most common forms of research projects taken up by students of Literature. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Loreto College, Kolkata organised a workshop on research methodology for the Semester VI undergraduate students of the Department of English on April 16 and April 19, 2024. A Five - Day Workshop on Research Methodology in Social Science for Advanced Learnerswas organisedduring October 9-13, 2023 to inculcate critical thinking and analytical skills. The participating teams were asked to create their own hypothetical political party, including a unique party logo and slogan not resembling those of any existing political party. They were also required to discuss their party manifesto in their presentations.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

On March 14, 2024, 12 student members and two staff advisors of the Library Society of Loreto College, Kolkata visited the Kolkata Police Limelight Library and Museum. The students went on a tour through the exhibits and information boards. These displays showcased the history of the Kolkata Police Force and the city. The Department of Political Science organized a study tour for thirdyear students on March 2, 2024, to the Alipore Jail Museum. A total of 35 students participated in the tour. The Alipore Jail Museum offered a comprehensive exploration, encompassing Barracks, Gallows, Police Museum, Galleries on Freedom Fighters, exhibits on display, Open Theatre, and the Cellular Jail with voice assistance. On February 21, 2024, the Library Society commemorated Bhasha Dibosh and International Mother Language Day through a cultural programme. A musical was organised that explored various facets of the day and its significance. On January 16, 2024, a special lecture on "Understanding the Past for a Sustainable Future: Oral Narratives and Environment" was organised for the Semester I students of History Major and IDC. The session helped the students to connect the heritage of a place to its environment and dwelt on how heritage shapes the collective consciousness and identity of a region or locality. The UG Semester V and PG Semester I students of the Department of English, Loreto College, Kolkata set out to exploretales related to the city's water heritage through an excursion entitled "Exploring the Goddess on Earth." on January 14, 2024. On January 9, 2024, Semester III History Honours and Semester V History Elective students of Loreto College, Kolkata visited the Alipore Museum. This was followed by another visit to the Museum by the Semester I History Major students on February 2, 2024. The entire complex featured several exhibits showcasing the life of the people within-their sufferings, their plight, and, most importantly, their pride. On December 1, 2023, the Department of B.Ed., Loreto College, Kolkata organized an exhibition on Mahatma Gandhi to commemorate his contribution to various disciplines. The theme of

the exhibition was 'Mahatma Gandhi: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow.' It focused on different aspects of Gandhiji's life and sought to extend curricular knowledge into practical work.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The institutions have taken initiatives to transform its curriculum towards Outcome-based Education by organising several visits to industries and places of heritage and importance. On May 23, 2024, Semester IV students of the Department of English, Loreto College, Kolkata visited the South Park Street Cemetery, accompanied and guided by Dr. Subhasree Basu. The field trip served as an extension of classroom lectures on Graveyard Poetry, which is an integral part of the departmental curriculum. The Semester IV students of the Department of Geography, Loreto College, Kolkata, accompanied by two teachers, embarked on a field trip to Aizawl, Mizoram from April 29 to May 6, 2024. A beautiful hill city, Aizawl, the capital of Mizoram. The field trip effectively bridged the gap between classroom theories and real-world scenarios, enabling students to amalgamate theoretical concepts with practical applications. The Department of Economics of Loreto College, Kolkata organised an industrial visit to the Keventer Agro Limited, located in Barasat, North 24 Parganas, on April 6, 2024. The excursion served as an enriching experience for the students as it bridged the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application. The Semester VI students of the Department of Psychology, Loreto College, Kolkata embarked on a field visit to People Power India, a prominent human resources and management consultancy firm situated in Park Circus on March 21 and 22, 2024. During their visit, students engaged directly with Mr. Mukherjee, benefiting immensely from his wealth of experience in human resource management (HRM) and organisational development. On March 14, 2024, 12 student members and two staff advisors of the Library Society of Loreto College, Kolkata visited the Kolkata Police Limelight Library and Museum. The Department of Political Science organized a study tour for third-year students on March 2, 2024, to the Alipore Jail Museum. This excursion served as an exposure for the students of the department providing them with a profound understanding of the political history of the country. The UG Semester V and PG Semester I students of the Department of English, Loreto College, Kolkata set out to explore such tales related to the city's water heritage through an excursion entitled "Exploring the Goddess on Earth." The Department of Political Science, Loreto College, Kolkata convened the annual students' meet on April 5, 2024, known as Dialego. This year's theme, "Emerging India in a Multipolar World Order," had set the stage for an engaging exploration of India's evolving position on the global

stage. On May 16, 2024, the Department of History in collaboration with the History Society of Loreto College organized their annual event Historia. On October 8, 2023, the Department of Economics in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) hosted the annual inter-year quiz competition known as IGNITION to help students understand the need know the contemporary issues to build a nexus between the theory and the practical. On May 28, 2024, the Department of Economics organised its annual inter-collegiate academic fest, Ecolore on the theme Economic Growth and Distributive Justice: Perspectives for a Changing World to help our students move beyond the curriculum and develop innovative ideas and generate interdisciplinary and collaborative solutions to address the multifaceted challenges facing the global economy today. Five Semester I students of the Department of English, Loreto College, Kolkata participated in an invigorating event entitled "U.S.-India Arts to Fight Climate Change," held at the U.S. Pavilion of the 47th International Kolkata Book Fair on January 31, 2024. Recognising the looming threat posed by climate change to the Earth's common future and the varied impact it has on the different genders, the United States Consulate General, Kolkata organised a panel discussion at the U.S. Pavilion of the International Kolkata Book Fair on January 20, 2024. Students of Loreto College attended the panel discussion. On February 8, 2024, the Department of History and the History Society of Loreto College, Kolkata hosted noted author, activist, and feminist Dr. Jael Silliman for a discussion on her latest book, Shalome Rides a Royal Elephant. The Times of India, in collaboration with Loreto College, Kolkata, organized a book reading session with the eminent author Karuna Ezara Parikh for the Semester 1 students of the college on December 14, 2023. On December 8, 2023, the Semester I trainees of the Department of B.Ed. at Loreto College, Kolkata celebrated Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav with a thoughtful exploration of the literary works of Shri Subramania Bharati. The event featured a dynamic discussion enhanced by a comprehensive PowerPoint presentation, a soulful recital of poems, and an engaging dramatic performance. On November 29, 2023, the Semester I trainees of the Department of B.Ed. at Loreto College, Kolkata celebrated Bharatiya Bhasha Utsav by organizing and participating in an essaywriting competition on the topic 'Language and its importance.' The event aimed to foster awareness of and appreciation for linguistic diversity among the students. On October 17, 2023, the teachertrainees of the Department of B.Ed., Loreto College, Kolkata organized a lively and educational quiz on the languages recognized by the Indian Constitution in Class 7B of St. Teresa's Secondary A storytelling session in Malayalam and Gujarati was School. conducted by two B.Ed. trainee teachers at Loreto Day School, Dharamtala on October 11, 2023. The session was attended by 41

students of the school. A second storytelling session in Bengali was conducted by a B.Ed. trainee teacher at Loreto House, Park Street, on October 13, 2023. The total number of students present for this session was 50. On October 9th, 2023, the Media Society of Loreto College organized a standup comedy event 'The Social Satire Slam' in the Media Lab. to provide a holistic educational experience that extends beyond classrooms. On November 29, 2023, the Department of Political Science at Loreto College, Kolkata organized a programme to observe Constitution Day, also known as Samvidhan Diwas. This is an annual event that honours the adoption of the Constitution of India on November 26, 1949. The portrayal provided a holistic understanding of both radical and moderate nationalism, offering insights into the complexities of the nation's ideological journey. The Department of History, Loreto College, in collaboration with the History Society, organized a film screening of Satyajit Ray's Asani Sanket, which was followed by a discussion.. During the interactive session, the students examined the caste system prevalent in early twentieth-century rural Bengal and also noted how the caste system broke down in the face of the hunger and famine that engulfed Bengal during this time.

As the college is affiliated to University of Calcutta, all examinations are conducted adhering to the academic calendar. Currently, the institution has two batches of CBCS and one batch under CCF. Under CBCS Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) is carried out in the form of University Internal Assessment and tutorials as prescribed by the University. Under CCF, tutorials and practical examinations are held as per the requirement of the university.

The University examination schedule is uploaded on the website. The departments conduct class tests, assignments, discussions, presentations for which rosters are prepared by the departments and shared with the students. The university appoints Internal and External examiners for practical -based papers in subjects like Geography, Psychology, Economics and Education. Examiners and Head examiners for Theory papers are appointed by the university and faculty members assigned with this responsibility ensure smooth conduct of examinations.

B.Ed students are evaluated through Formative and Summative assessments. Both theory and practicum examinations are conducted at the end of every semester. They are assessed on the basis of projects, presentations and internal assessments. External examiners are appointed by the university for practicum papers. Assessment of trainee teachers are also conducted through school internships by the educators forming an integral part of the course.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The institution adopts measures to cater to the needs of the different level of learners. A five-day workshop on Research Methodology in Social Science for Advanced Learners was organised by IQAC to provide theoretical inputs of the research methodology but also expose the participants to the practical aspects of research in Social Sciences and other research related problems which the research scholars confront during their research work. Workshop on Research Methodology in English was also conducted for the undergraduate and post graduate students.

Advanced learners are encouraged to write well-researched papers and present the paper for Research Cell presentation.

Bridge courses are designed in such a manner so as to help the first -year students bridge the gap between school and higher education curriculum.

Remedial classes are organised for slow learners.

Two mentoring sessions are held for every student per semester. The students are are divided into groups of six or seven and each teacher shoulders the responsibility of mentoring the students on a one-to-one basis. The departments maintain records of the mentoring sessions.

Sessions were organised to give information to students about pursuing higher studies abroad. Sessions were also held to help students explore alternative career options.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

As Loreto College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta, it conducts the Internal assessments as per the prescribed directives. A staff meeting is held with the principal regarding the smooth conduction of the examinations. The Heads of Department accordingly prepare a roster and share it with the students at least two weeks in advance. Under CCF the Internal Assessment component is absent. Tutorials are conducted as per the requirements of the university.

A Continuous Internal Evaluation is conducted in form of assessments, presentations, term papers, assignments, and projects. The evaluated assignments are discussed with the students for improvement at an individual level. Students are encouraged to clarify their doubts and resubmit the modified assignments. This ensures that the specified learning outcomes and programme specific outcomes are attained.

The Topics for Term papers are chosen in such a manner so that originality and creativity can be promoted. The faculty members inform the students about Copyright laws and plagiarism. Application -based topics are chosen to understand the ability of the students to express themselves and test their acumen.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The grievances of the students regarding any academic issue are communicated to the Head of the Department and the issue is resolved at the department level. If there is any modification required for any marks related to college assessments, the respective teacher of the department is informed and the change is made in the department record with the Head of the Department's permission.

Internal Complaints Committee settle internal examination related grievances as per the prescribed guidelines.

Internal examinations as per the CBCS system are conducted at the end of every semester and marks are uploaded into the University portal within the stipulated time. It is a transparent, time bound efficient mechanism. In case of grievances with respect to University examinations marks, the student is informed about the dates for submission of Review or RTI forms via the college website. Under CCF, the Internal assessment component is absent. The students are explained the difference between a Review and RTI, which helps them to seek relevant redressal. 2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution.

Keeping in mind the student-centric teaching - learning process, the time plans specify the outcomes that are to be achieved and the methods of assessment are incorporated in the Time Plans. They are displayed in the classrooms before the commencement of the session. Every time plan has been designed to provide a detailed description of the objectives so as to focus on outcome-based syllabus. Keeping in mind, CCF under NEP, Experiential learning, application -based learning outcomes are highlighted.

The methods of assessment include both summative as well as formative assessment methods such as assignments, internal assessments, in addition to presentations, inductive and deductive reasoning, synthesis and analysis, group discussions, problemsolving methods, field surveys and preparation of research papers.

Slow learners are identified and remedial classes are conducted by the teachers of different departments.

Students are exposed to industrial visits, places of importance and heritage as part of experiential learning.

Students are encouraged to participate in inter college academic fests where they get the opportunity of participating in paper -presentation, debate, quiz, essay competition, case study and mock parliament. The different departments in the college organize events to provide a platform to sharpen

Students are also guided competitive and entrance examinations. Records of student progression to institutions of higher education and Placement details are maintained. The feedback of the students for every college initiative is critically analyzed and suggestions incorporated in future endeavours.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution has always provided upgraded infrastructural facilities for the betterment of the teaching-learning process so as to provide holistic development of the students. Wireless internet connection enables access of content from the web. Wi-Fi facility is accessible on the campus for the faculty and students of the college with AIRTEL Leased Line services (8Mbps) and Alliance Broadband connectivity (50Mbps). Updated GPS devices and meteorological instruments have been procured to impart quality education and equip graduates with employability skills. Quark Express software is installed in eleven computers in the Media lab which assists journalism students in curriculum. The smart boards and projectors in the classrooms facilitate the teaching-learning process. The Concert Hall and auditorium also have mounted projectors. The Central library conducts orientation for the new entrants to appraise them on the facilities offered and rules for the maintenance of the same. In addition to the Central Library, each department has a Seminar library which caters to discipline-specific needs of the students, particularly Journals, Census Reports and Statistical handbooks. Detailed Teaching Plans are displayed in the departments highlighting the Learning Objectives and Outcomes. The air-conditioned auditorium and concert hall provide facilities for both online and hybrid webinars.

The process of Library automation started in 2001-02 with creation of a database of its holdings using CDS/ISIS for Windows (WINISIS) software, from which it moved on to ILMS LIBSYS in 2004. Retro conversion of the holdings continued till 2008, by when all holdings were barcoded. Barcoded Membership cards were issued from 2005.

Since 2013 the Loreto College library is fully computerized with integrated open source library management software Koha version 3.22.01.000 which runs on Ubuntu 14 platform which, in 2015 was integrated with the RFID system. It works with the RFID system through a middleware NISO NCIP RFID Server Software Layer.

In 2022-23, server license of the IBM rack server has been renewed. Old Koha server has been converted into stand-alone machine with licensed Windows 10 Pro installed, and Office LTSC Professional Plus 2021(Edu).

All computers in the Central Library (Koha1, Koha2 and Koha3) have been upgraded to licensed Windows 10 Pro, and Office LTSC Professional Plus 2021(Edu) installed in these computers along with two computers in the PG Library.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

The Governing Body is the apex decision-making authority, comprising the Province Leader (President), the Principal (Secretary), Sisters from the Loreto Community, a Jesuit academician, representatives from the teaching and non-teaching categories, alumnae and a parent representative. The Principal is the administrative head. She ensures that routine operations are properly conducted, through interactions and meetings with all stakeholders. The Societies for co-curricular activities organize events which are aimed at enhancing the overall development of students under the guidance of the Staff Advisors. The Student Council represents the opinion of the students in important matters of the college. The student representatives put forward their suggestions in IQAC meetings.

Administrative posts like the Bursar, IQAC Coordinator, Officer-in-Charge of Examinations, Dean of General Students and Coordinator of the Post Graduate Section are delegated responsibilities in administrative matter. The Staff representatives act as a bridge between the staff and the Principal. They hold regular meetings to ensure smooth conduct of University examinations and Staff matters. The Librarians are assisted by Helpers for the Central and B.Ed libraries. The Planning and Monitoring Boards are integral parts of the institution. The Internal Complaints Committee and the Anti-Ragging Cell deal with grievances of students. Office Staff comprising an Accountant, Cashier and Office Assistants, who are in-charge of the salary, tax and audit related matters. Two Management faculty oversee IT-related work.

6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non- teaching staff

A reliable Performance Appraisal system plays an integral part in the improvement of the organization. Questionnaires and Feedback forms have been designed for each of the stakeholders, i.e. students, teachers, alumnae and employers. Students of all departments submit online Teachers Assessment Questionnaire (TAQ) annually to maintain anonymity of students. The feedback of the students is analysed statistically and these scores provide an overall index of teaching efficiency and are visually represented by statistical representations for each department. The TAQs are analyzed by the Principal with each teacher and the strengths and challenges are addressed helping the teachers to identify the areas which need improvement and thereby enhance the quality of teachinglearning.

The institution follows the Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) suggested by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. The Academic Performance Indices (API) are calculated by the faculty as per the proforma at the end of the academic year. These scores are integral for their career advancements and promotions. In addition to these, there are the Student Satisfaction Survey, Students' Feedback on Syllabus, Teachers' Feedback on Syllabus and the Alumnae Feedback on Syllabus questionnaires which are uploaded in the college website.

Loreto College is aided by the Government of West Bengal, thus a Government Auditor appointed by their Audit Department conducts the external financial audit. The Audit Report is placed by the Secretary of the Loreto College Provident Fund Trust (LCPFT) at the Annual General Meeting. The Provident Fund receipts of the individual members are distributed at the AGM. The College conducts internal and external audits regularly. The Annual Accounts is prepared at the culmination of the financial year on March 31 according to the guidelines of The Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal and is the systematic examination of the accounts by the government auditor followed by a physical verification of the inventory like documents and vouchers and assets (fixed and movable). The internal audit recommends ways to improve the institution's financial (recurring and non-recurring) and administrative infrastructure. The Internal Auditor appointed by the Bursar's Department of Loreto House Education Society of Calcutta, conducts the audit quarterly and annually. The Budget of the institution is prepared annually and presented to the Bursar's Department of Loreto House Education Society of Calcutta. Utilization Certificates for funds received from external sources from the Government, UGC and other external funding bodies are certified by the Internal Auditor. The Annual Audit of the Loreto College Alumnae Association is prepared by an independent agency under West Bengal Societies Act annually. The Audit Report is read out at the Annual General Meeting.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

An inventory of funds is generated on the basis of student intake, faculty requirements, library, laboratory and infrastructural requirements for each financial year. These are worked out meticulously by the Principal, Accountant and the Bursar of the Society. Three quotations are submitted by the Departments of Computer, Geography and Psychology for acquiring instruments/ devices for laboratory upgradation. A buy-back policy for redundant devices ensures optimum utilization of funds. An organised system of e-waste is maintained by the college. Efforts are made to explore new avenues for investment with less risk and higher dividends. Enrichment and Add-on-courses tailored to students needs are introduced, which is a means of resource generation. Vermicompost, institution's green initiative is packed in environmental friendly recyclable packets and sold at college events like Reunion, World Environment Day and Parents Orientation at a nominal cost thus ensuring income generation and solid waste management. Loreto College being a private aided institution, receives grant under the Pay Packet Scheme for the salaries of sanctioned staff The college requests for funding in accordance with the 2F and 12B UGC status. The college has received funds from ICSSR and private sponsors for organising workshop and international seminar. Sponsors are sought for events conducted in the institution as part of the CSR. All Resource Mobilization Funds are deliberated and approved by the Governing Body, Planning Board and are placed before the IQAC.

Solid waste is managed through the separation of biodegradable wet waste through the use of colour-schemed collection bins -yellow and blue. Wet vegetable waste from the Canteen is used to feed earthworms in the vermi-compost troughs. The vermicompost thus generated is used for the fruit-bearing trees and flowering plants in the campus and sell to stakeholders.

E-Waste is collected in a special labeled wooden box beside the college office and this is disposed off to a collection center. Liquid Waste management is through proper sewerage system to prevent leakage and contamination of waste-borne diseases. Rainwater run-off steps through a spacious lawn to recharge the deep-water aquifer of

underground water table.

Loreto College being a Liberal Arts College does not use hazardous chemicals and radio-active material. Biomedical waste in the form of solid napkins is disposed off by women support staff appropriately.

Under CCF, tutorials and practical examinations are held as per the requirement of the university.

The University examination schedule is uploaded on the website. The departments conduct class tests, assignments, discussions, presentations for which rosters are prepared by the departments and shared with the students. The university appoints Internal and External examiners for practical -based papers in subjects like Geography, Psychology, Economics and Education. Examiners and Head examiners for Theory papers are appointed by the university and faculty members assigned with this responsibility ensure smooth conduct of examinations.

B.Ed students are evaluated through Formative and Summative assessments. Both theory and practicum examinations are conducted at the end of every semester. They are assessed on the basis of projects, presentations and internal assessments. External examiners are appointed by the university for practicum papers. 2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

The institution adopts measures to cater to the needs of the different level of learners. A five-day workshop on Research Methodology in Social Science for Advanced Learners was organised by IQAC to provide theoretical inputs of the research methodology but also expose the participants to the practical aspects of research in Social Sciences and other research related problems which the research scholars confront during their research work. Workshop on Research Methodology in English was also conducted for the undergraduate and post graduate students.

Advanced learners are encouraged to write well-researched papers and present the paper for Research Cell presentation.

Bridge courses are designed in such a manner so as to help the first -year students bridge the gap between school and higher education curriculum.

Remedial classes are organised for slow learners.

Two mentoring sessions are held for every student per semester. The students are are divided into groups of six or seven and each teacher shoulders the responsibility of mentoring the students on a one-to-one basis. The departments maintain records of the mentoring sessions.

Sessions were organised to give information to students about pursuing higher studies abroad. Sessions were also held to help students explore alternative career options.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

As Loreto College is affiliated to the University of Calcutta, it conducts the Internal assessments as per the prescribed directives. A staff meeting is held with the principal regarding the smooth conduction of the examinations. The Heads of Department accordingly prepare a roster and share it with the students at least two weeks in advance. Under CCF the Internal Assessment component is absent. Tutorials are conducted as per the requirements of the university.

A Continuous Internal Evaluation is conducted in form of assessments, presentations, term papers, assignments, and projects. The evaluated assignments are discussed with the students for improvement at an individual level. Students are encouraged to clarify their doubts and resubmit the modified assignments. This ensures that the specified learning outcomes and programme specific outcomes are attained.

The Topics for Term papers are chosen in such a manner so that originality and creativity can be promoted. The faculty members inform the students about Copyright laws and plagiarism. Application -based topics are chosen to understand the ability of the students to express themselves and test their acumen.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The grievances of the students regarding any academic issue are communicated to the Head of the Department and the issue is resolved at the department level. If there is any modification required for any marks related to college assessments, the respective teacher of the department is informed and the change is made in the department record with the Head of the Department's permission.

Internal Complaints Committee settle internal examination related grievances as per the prescribed guidelines.

Internal examinations as per the CBCS system are conducted at the end of every semester and marks are uploaded into the University portal within the stipulated time. It is a transparent, time bound efficient mechanism. In case of grievances with respect to University examinations marks, the student is informed about the dates for submission of Review or RTI forms via the college website. Under CCF, the Internal assessment component is absent. The students are explained the difference between a Review and RTI, which helps them to seek relevant redressal. However, the college does not have the authority to either follow up or ensure time bound results from the University.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution has always provided upgraded infrastructural facilities for the betterment of the teaching-learning process so as to provide holistic development of the students. Wireless internet connection enables access of content from the web. Wi-Fi facility is accessible on the campus for the faculty and students of the college with AIRTEL Leased Line services (8Mbps) and Alliance Broadband connectivity (50Mbps). Updated GPS devices and meteorological instruments have been procured to impart quality education and equip graduates with employability skills. Quark Express software is installed in eleven computers in the Media lab which assists journalism students in curriculum. The smart boards and projectors in the classrooms facilitate the teaching-learning process. The Concert Hall and auditorium also have mounted projectors. The Central library conducts orientation for the new entrants to appraise them on the facilities offered and rules for the maintenance of the same. In addition to the Central Library, each department has a Seminar library which caters to discipline-specific needs of the students, particularly Journals, Census Reports and Statistical handbooks. Detailed Teaching Plans are displayed in the departments highlighting the Learning Objectives and Outcomes. The air-conditioned auditorium and concert hall provide facilities for both online and hybrid webinars.

Yoga is offered as a course to B.Ed students. International Yoga Day is celebrated by students.

The different societies such as the Eastern and Western Culture, Dramatics, AICUF societies and SPICMACAY organize various events and the members also participate in various inter- college events. Samagam, the annual fest of the college and OKTOFEST are organised to provides a platform to display their talents in the field of music dance, art and craft, drama etc. . Basanta Utsav was organised to demonstrate the power of art to foster connection and joy.

These events are held in the Concert Hall (3175 sq.ft) and Auditorium (1890 sq.ft), having a capacity of 400 and 250 respectively. The college has two Grand pianos and one cottage piano in addition to guitars, drums, keyboards, harmoniums and tablas.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

Loreto College Library is a fully equipped lending library. The collection comprises books, e-books, e-journals, print journals, CDs & DVDs, and e-resources from NLIST-IFLIBNET.

Books from the Collection are housed in the Central Library, Post Graduate Library and the Department Libraries. All books are processed in the Central Library.

Library automation

The process of Library automation started in 2001-02 with creation of a database of its holdings using CDS/ISIS for Windows (WINISIS) software, from which it moved on to ILMS LIBSYS in 2004. Retro conversion of the holdings continued till 2008, by when all holdings were barcoded. Barcoded Membership cards were issued from 2005.

Since 2013 the Loreto College library is fully computerized with integrated open source library management software Koha version 3.22.01.000 which runs on Ubuntu 14 platform which, in 2015 was integrated with the RFID system. It works with the RFID system through a middleware NISO NCIP RFID Server Software Layer.

In 2022-23, server license of the IBM rack server has been renewed. Old Koha server has been converted into stand-alone machine with licensed Windows 10 Pro installed, and Office LTSC Professional Plus 2021(Edu).

All computers in the Central Library (Koha1, Koha2 and Koha3) have been upgraded to licensed Windows 10 Pro, and Office LTSC Professional Plus 2021(Edu) installed in these computers along with two computers in the PG Library.

240 GB SSD and RAM have been installed in three computers in the Central Library for better performance.

The College Supervisor is in-charge of the overall infrastructure. There is a provision for registering a complaint, on which prompt action is taken by a team comprising of an electrician, plumber and carpenter.

AMC for CCTV camera, Biometric attendance, Wi-Fi network, air conditioners, fire safety system, elevator, water purifiers, generators and reprographic machines are in effect and are renewed annually.

6.2.2 - The functioning of the institutional bodies is effective and efficient as visible from policies, administrative setup, appointment and service rules, procedures, etc.

The Governing Body is the apex decision-making authority, comprising the Province Leader (President), the Principal (Secretary), Sisters from the Loreto Community, a Jesuit academician, representatives from the teaching and non-teaching categories, alumnae and a parent representative.The Principal is the administrative head. She ensures that routine operations are properly conducted, through interactions and meetings with all stakeholders. The Staff representatives act as a bridge between the staff and the Principal. They hold regular meetings to ensure smooth conduct of University examinations and Staff matters. The Librarians are assisted by Helpers for the Central and B.Ed libraries.

The Planning and Monitoring Boards are integral parts of the institution. The Internal Complaints Committee and the Anti-Ragging Cell deal with grievances of students. Office Staff comprising an Accountant, Cashier and Office Assistants, who are in-charge of the salary, tax and audit related matters. Two Management faculty oversee IT-related work.

6.3.5 - Institutions Performance Appraisal System for teaching and non- teaching staff

A reliable Performance Appraisal system plays an integral part in the improvement of the organization. Questionnaires and Feedback forms have been designed for each of the stakeholders, i.e. students, teachers, alumnae and employers. Students of all departments submit online Teachers Assessment Questionnaire (TAQ) annually to maintain anonymity of students. The feedback of the students is analysed statistically and these scores provide an overall index of teaching efficiency and are visually represented by statistical representations for each department. The TAQs are analyzed by the Principal with each teacher and the strengths and challenges are addressed helping the teachers to identify the areas which need improvement and thereby enhance the quality of teaching- learning.

The institution follows the Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) suggested by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. The Academic Performance Indices (API) are calculated by the faculty as per the proforma at the end of the academic year. These scores are integral for their career advancements and promotions. In addition to these, there are the Student Satisfaction Survey, Students' Feedback on Syllabus, Teachers' Feedback on Syllabus and the Alumnae Feedback on Syllabus questionnaires which are uploaded in the college website.

Loreto College is aided by the Government of West Bengal, thus a Government Auditor appointed by their Audit Department conducts the external financial audit. The Audit Report is placed by the Secretary of the Loreto College Provident Fund Trust (LCPFT) at the Annual General Meeting. The Provident Fund receipts of the individual members are distributed at the AGM. The College conducts internal and external audits regularly. The Annual Accounts is prepared at the culmination of the financial year on March 31 according to the guidelines of The Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal and is the systematic examination of the accounts by the government auditor followed by a physical verification of the inventory like documents and vouchers and assets (fixed and movable).The internal audit recommends ways to improve the institution's financial (recurring and non- recurring) and administrative infrastructure. The Internal Auditor appointed by the Bursar's Department of Loreto House Education Society of Calcutta, conducts the audit quarterly and annually. The Budget of the institution is prepared annually and presented to the Bursar's Department of Loreto House Education Society of Calcutta. Utilization Certificates for funds received from external sources from the Government, UGC and other external funding bodies are certified by the Internal Auditor. The Annual Audit of the Loreto College Alumnae Association is prepared by an independent agency under West Bengal Societies Act annually. The Audit Report is read out at the Annual General Meeting.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

An inventory of funds is generated on the basis of student intake, faculty requirements, library, laboratory and infrastructural requirements for each financial year. These are worked out meticulously by the Principal, Accountant and the Bursar of the Society. Three quotations are submitted by the Departments of Computer, Geography and Psychology for acquiring instruments/ devices for laboratory upgradation. A buy-back policy for redundant devices ensures optimum utilization of funds. An organised system of e-waste is maintained by the college. Efforts are made to explore new avenues for investment with less risk and higher dividends. Enrichment and Add-oncourses tailored to students needs are introduced, which is a means of resource generation. Vermicompost, institution's green initiative is packed in environmental friendly recyclable packets and sold at college events like Reunion, World Environment Day and Parents Orientation at a nominal cost thus ensuring income generation and solid waste management. Loreto College being a private aided institution, receives grant under the Pay Packet Scheme for the salaries of sanctioned staff The college requests for funding in accordance with the 2F and 12B UGC status. The college has received funds from ICSSR and private sponsors for organising workshop and international seminar. Sponsors are sought for events conducted in the institution as part of the CSR. All Resource Mobilization Funds are deliberated and approved by the Governing Body, Planning Board and are placed before the IQAC.

Solid waste is managed through the separation of biodegradable wet waste through the use of colour-schemed collection bins -yellow and blue. Wet vegetable waste from the Canteen is used to feed earthworms in the vermi-compost troughs. The vermicompost thus generated is used for the fruit-bearing trees and flowering plants in the campus and sell to stakeholders.

E-Waste is collected in a special labeled wooden box beside the college office and this is disposed off to a collection center. Liquid Waste management is through proper sewerage system to prevent leakage and contamination of waste-borne diseases. Rainwater run-off steps through a spacious lawn to recharge the deep-water aquifer of underground water table.

Loreto College being a Liberal Arts College does not use hazardous chemicals and radio-active material. Biomedical waste in the form of solid napkins is disposed off by women support staff appropriately.
