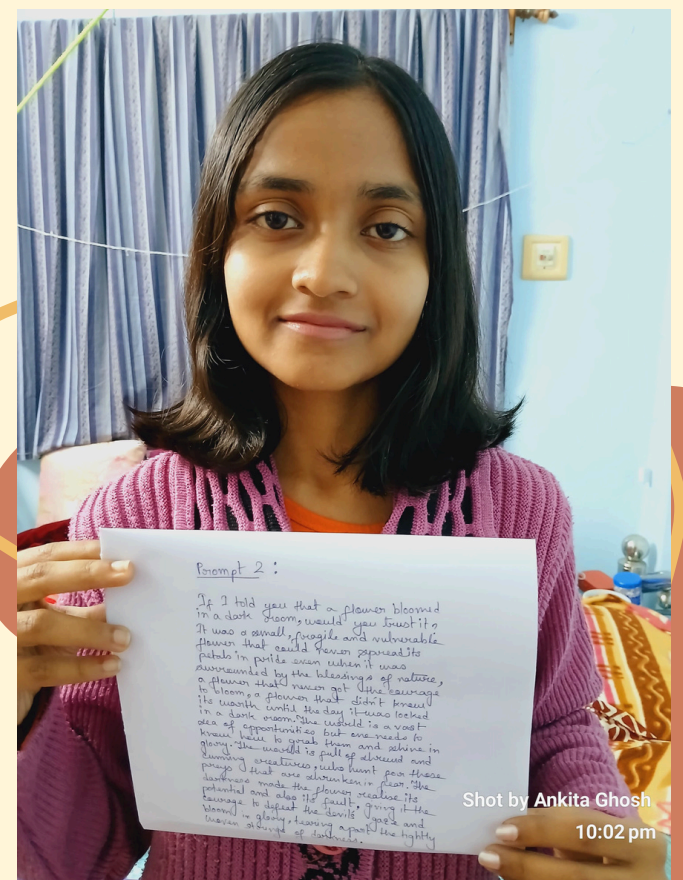
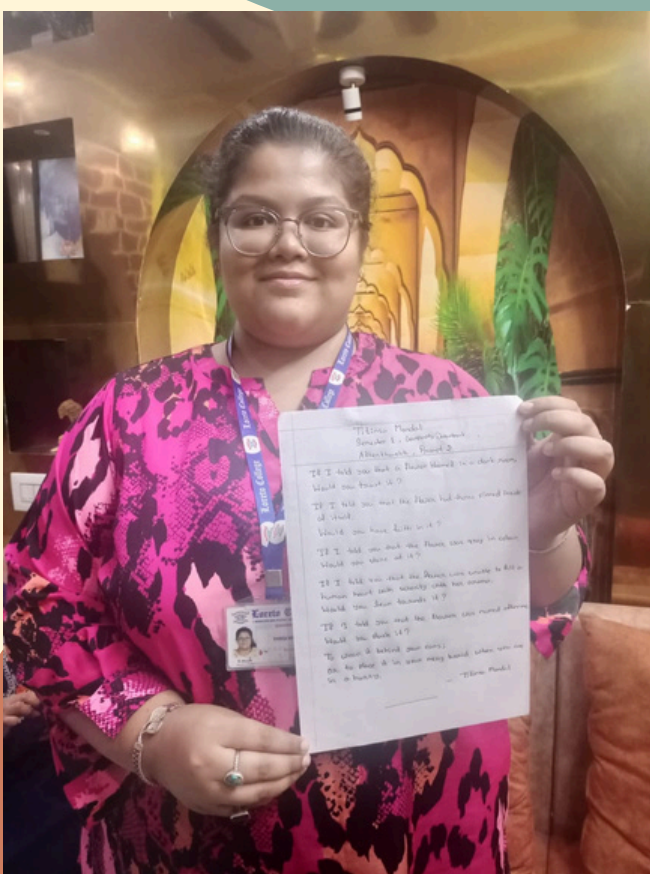
The competition comprised two categories:

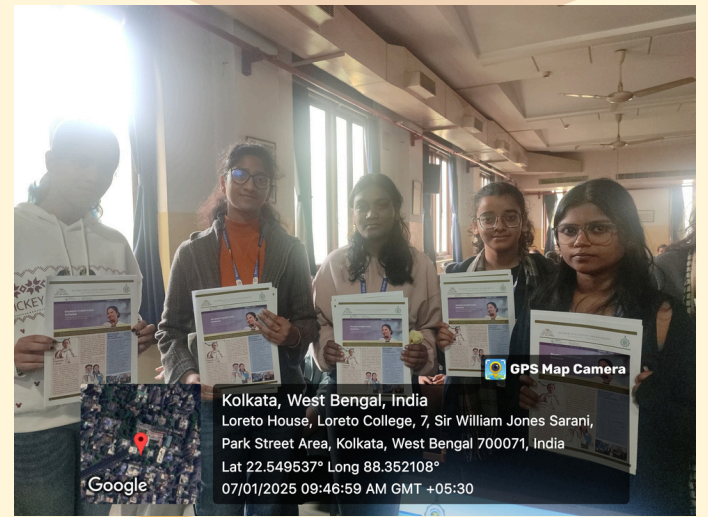


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## STUDENTS' WEEK 2025

### AWARENESS TALK ON STUDENT CREDIT CARD

As per the guidelines issued by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, for organizing Students' Week; an Awareness Camp on West Bengal Student Credit Card Scheme (WBSCCS) was held on 7/1/2025 at the Auditorium in Loreto College. The camp was conducted for purposes of sensitizing undergraduate students of Semester I about the loan provisions under WBSCCS. The camp was attended by 216 first year students from 9:15 to 10:00 A.M. With the help of a PowerPoint presentation, Dr. Debasree Sinha, the Nodal Officer for the scheme, explained to students the benefits of applying for student credit card, the eligibility criteria, and the necessary documents required for application. Additionally, IEC material in the form of the WBSCCS banner was displayed in the Auditorium. Dr. Suparna Bhattacharya, Mrs. Archita Roy Biswas (Nodal Officer), and Mrs. Sukanya Mullick (Help Desk) helped in the distribution of information leaflets to each Department.





# LORETO COLLEGE KOLKATA STUDENTS' WEEK 2025 HEALTH CAMP

The National Service Scheme Unit of Loreto College, Kolkata organised a Health Camp in collaboration with Allergy & Asthma Treatment Centre (a unit of NCD Immunomedicare Pvt. Ltd.) as part of the Students' Activity Week. The camp included an awareness talk on allergy and asthma which was attended by over 60 students as well as by the faculty of the college. Free Pulmonary Function Tests (PFTs) were conducted for students, teaching and non-teaching staff and the support staff of the college. Over fifty people underwent PFTs in the camp.





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### INTERACTION WITH PARENTS

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## STUDENTS' WEEK 2025

### TALK ON DIGITAL EDUCATION

On Wednesday, 8th January, 2025, a session was conducted on 'Digital Education' by Ms. Chandrani Sengupta, Head, Department of Computer Science, for first semester students of the Department of B.Ed, Loreto College, Kolkata. The aim of the session was to educate the teacher trainees on the concept of Digital Education and also to create awareness on various new trends within this domain.

The session began with a conversation on the concept of Digital Education. It was an interactive session where the discussion included the utility of digital resources, educational applications, distance learning and online database. The session highlighted on the basic types of digital learning whereby the teacher trainees learned about mobile learning, simulated learning, MOOCs, and SPOCs. The talk also emphasised on the core skills of digital education. Skills like effective communication, critical thinking, evaluation, and e-safety were communicated elaborately. The resource person shared with the students about management of data using different byte sizes, starting from a single byte (B) to yottabyte (YB) storage capacity.

The talk further extended about the future of digital learning and its emergent trends. This included blended learning, cross-cultural learning, and game-based learning. Introduction to the concept of block-chain technology and its functioning were also highlighted. Discussions on cyber-security awareness, role of encryption, digital identity management, ethical hacking,



and rise of insider threats were also given prominence.

The session on "Digital Education" was a very informative and enriching one for the B.Ed students. It aided them to get an exposure to the diverse perspectives with an inclusive way of learning.







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### AWARENESS TALK CUM HELP DESK FOR SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMMES

As an initiative for observation of Students' Week 2025, on January 8, Loreto College organised an awareness talk for scholarship programmes offered to students by the Government of West Bengal. Dr. Debika Guha, Associate Professor, Department of Education, Loreto College, delivered the talk, with the Semester 3 UG students as attendees.

The session was inaugurated by Ms Sreeparna Dasgupta of the Political Science department whereafter it was handed over to Dr. Guha. Dr. Guha comprehensively explained the various scholarships available to the students in West Bengal, namely SVMCM (Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship), Aikyashree and the Post Matric Scholarship. She elucidated the aims, eligibility criteria, family income thresholds, and documents required to apply for the scholarships successfully. Furthermore, she concluded with a helpful "Do's and Don't's" slide, which clarified any remaining doubts.

The students were also made aware of the help desk available in college under Ms. Anne Biswas, whom they may approach for any clarity or assistance. Overall, all students benefitted upon learning the opportunities they may avail through these scholarships.
