The theme, "Gender and Politics," delves into the intricate intersections of power, representation, and gendered experiences within political life. It seeks to explore how structures of patriarchy, culture, and policy shape the participation of women and gender minorities in governance and public decision-making. From the global struggle for suffrage and equality to India's contemporary debates on representation and the Women's Reservation Bill, the theme highlights both significant progress and enduring inequalities. By engaging with feminist thought, intersectionality, and lived experiences, it aims to reimagine polities as a space for inclusion, justice, and transformative social change.

CONCEPT NOTE

Gender remains one of the most crucial and contested categories in understanding the dynamics of power, representation, and justice in contemporary politics. Across the world, the intersection of gender and politics has evolved as a significant site of enquiry and activism, reflecting broader struggles for equality, inclusion, and rights-based governance. This seminar aims to explore the multifaceted relationship between gender and politics, situating the discussion within both Indian and global contexts.

Globally, the feminist movement and gender discourse have redefined traditional notions of citizenship, political participation, and leadership. From the suffrage movements of the early twentieth century to contemporary campaigns for reproductive rights, equal pay, and representation in political institutions, women and gender minorities have challenged patriarchal structures and demanded transformative change. The rise of global frameworks such as the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), the Beijing Platform for Action, and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 5: Gender Equality) further underscore the international commitment to gender parity in politics and governance.

In India, the relationship between gender and politics reflects the complex interplay of democracy, culture, and social hierarchy. Despite constitutional guarantees of equality and notable examples of women in leadership—from the national to the local level—the barriers to full and equal participation persist. Issues such as gender-based violence, economic marginalization, social stereotypes, and institutional biases continue to impede women's access to political power. The recent Women's Reservation Bill (Nari Shakti Vandana Adhiniyam, 2023) marks a significant step toward greater representation, but also raises debates about implementation, intersectionality, and the future of feminist politics in India.

In the international arena, women have emerged as pivotal actors in peace processes: as negotiators, mediators, survivors turned activists, and as victims of conflict who refuse to remain silent. Recognitions such as the Nobel Peace Prize awarded to Narges Mohammadi in 2023 for her fight against the oppression of women in Iran and María Gorina Machado in 2025 highlights how women's rights, democracy and peace are deeply interlinked. At the same time, the global rise of violent extremism, terrorism and polarized politics raises urgent questions about how gender informs the causes, participation and consequences of conflict.

Dialego 2025-2026 seeks to engage scholars, academicians and students, in an interdisciplinary dialogue on how gender shapes, and is shaped by, political processes and institutions. It will address themes such as feminist political theory, representation and participation, gender in political movements, media and gendered narratives, and the impact of globalization and digital spaces on gendered identities and activism.

By juxtaposing Indian experiences with global trajectories, the seminar aims to promote critical reflection on the possibilities and challenges of building more inclusive and equitable political systems. It will encourage participants to reimagine the political beyond formal institutions—recognizing the everyday acts of resistance and leadership that constitute gendered forms of power and agency.

3. Present a policy specific, actionable policy recommendations addressing identified gaps
4. Outline implementation strategies including policy instruments, legal frameworks, and institutional mechanisms.
5. Summarize the key policy recommendations and their expected impact
6. Factual errors will result in penalties.
7. Points will be deducted for grammatical errors, with the evaluator holding the final decision.
8. Registration Desks: One downstairs. One outside the auditorium for event registration.
9. Result Will not be declared on the event days
10. Certificates will be sent to colleges.
11. The policy brief must be submitted in hardcopy at the registration desk on the day of the event .
