Institutional Swachhta Policy

An institutional Swachhta Policy was framed by the College and steps are being taken up to put it up in the form of a signage board within college premises.

Swachhta Policy of Loreto College, Kolkata

To institutionalize a culture of cleanliness and promoting a sustainable environment on campus.

Creation of Swachh Cell with the students: Setting up a Swachhta Cell with student representatives from all departments.

It will be responsible for ensuring clean and tidy classrooms. Keeping notice boards clean is the responsibility of the student representatives. If department classrooms are not cleaned satisfactorily the Swachhta representatives are to report the matter to the administration. The

Cell is also responsible for ensuring that lights and fans are turned off after use of a classroom. All dustbins must be emptied out daily at the end of the day. In case dustbins in classrooms are not clean at the beginning of a day, the matter must be reported.

Canteen Cleanliness

Highest standards of cleanliness to be maintained in the College canteen. Waste segregation is to be strictly followed in the Canteen and kitchen waste is used for vermicomposting.

Clean Energy

Solar Cells have been installed covering 40 % of the campus electricity needs.

Only LED bulbs to be used on campus.

Reducing Water Wastage : There should be constant monitoring of the drainage system.

Campus to be a plastic free zone: Campus must become plastic free.

Ensuring healthy and Green Environment:

Regular awareness programmes on health issues for staff and students.

Holding regular blood donation and medical camps.

Developing a rich herbal garden with medicinal plants.

Developing organic gardening the produce of which can be used for consumption purposes in college.

Organising regular tree plantation drives.


Promoting healthy lifestyle and consumption patterns; encouraging the use of the landscaped garden for yoga and medication.

 **Promote Environmental Consciousness:** Indoor water plants in reusable glass bottles and jars could be kept in classrooms in the near future. Plants along the department corridors to encourage environmental aesthetics.

 **Annual stock taking:** Departmental storage spaces, laboratory equipments and facilities are thoroughly cleaned. This ensures proper maintenance and workable conditions for instruments.

 **Bins at strategic locations:** Every classroom has a bin for collecting paper waste. Consumption of food within classrooms is strictly prohibited so as to prevent odour pollution from accumulation of decomposable waste.

 **Experiential learning:** During field visits students study waste management systems of societies in the study area. This way new and best practices of waste disposal of other communities are learnt & implemented wherever possible.

 **Energy Conservation:** Students are made aware to switch off the lights and fans after use.

Department of History

Policy document for Swachh Bharat to be implemented by the Department of History:

1. Take the students on heritage tours to educate them about the city's natural and built heritage which are at the risk of getting destroyed due to rampant littering. This is detrimental to the very existence of a city like Calcutta. Students should be encouraged to go for a clean drive of historic old buildings and the precincts of natural heritage sites in order to preserve the city's heritage, history and identity.
2. Educate students about Mahatma Gandhi and Gandhian ideals and inculcate in them the values of cleanliness and a clean India as envisioned by Gandhi. It should be emphasized that no work is beneath one's dignity and an unclean environment is detrimental to the inhabitants of the city. Students need to be encouraged to proactively keep their homes, their college and the nearby areas clean, thereby embodying the values of Gandhiji.
3. While teaching local history, analyse the history of Indore designated the cleanest city in India for the fourth year in a row and comprehend how changes in lifestyle and old habits could transform a city and the benefits it would render to the city dwellers in the long run.

1. **Recycling Bins:** Installation of recycling bins in classrooms used by the Department of Psychology.

Whatever recyclable waste is collected at the end of the month will be donated to an NGO that can upcycle it.

Clearing (and also cleaning) up the display boards at regular intervals as they not only catch your eyes but a lot of dust!

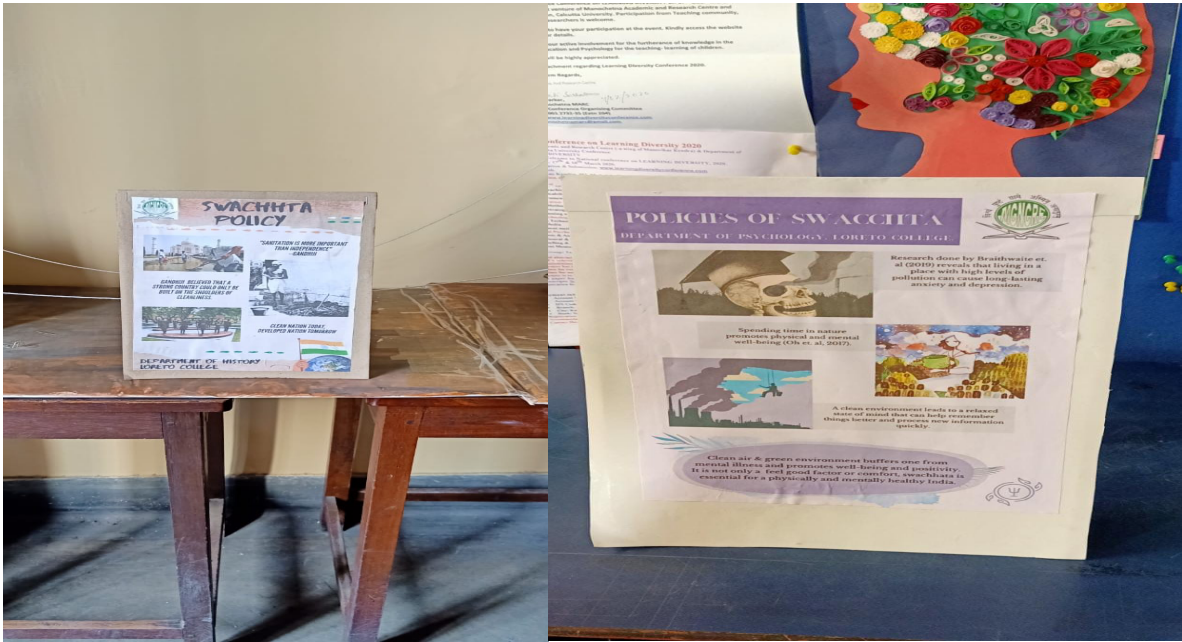
On the track :
